Treasurer's Reports

Insert: One Great Hour of Sharing Envelopes

Are you a warm and friendly person? Do you find it easy to greet new people? Do you go out of your way to speak to new and different people on Sunday morning?

Let's face it; when it comes to hospitality in our Church, we all need to be reminded from time to time what an extravagant welcome is and should be.

Here is some advice I received about greeting new people at Church. I think it is a great resource for us to familiarize ourselves with as we want to be welcoming and extravagantly hospitable with seekers and visitors who we meet at Church.

Avoid saying: "How old are you?" Say instead: "WHAT DID YOU THINK OF THE SERVICE TODAY?" A person's age is less important than a person's perspective.

Avoid saying: "ARE YOU NEW HERE?" Say instead: "I DON'T THINK WE'VE MET, MY NAME IS..." They might have been here before or they might have come back to Church.

Avoid saying: "WHAT DO YOU DO or WHAT YEAR ARE YOU IN SCHOOL?" Say instead: "SO TELL ME ABOUT YOURSELF." For those un- or under-employed, work topics are tricky - and assuming someone is a student implies you think they are a certain age. Give them the chance to talk about whatever they think is meaningful, which might or might not be about school or work.

Avoid saying: "WE NEED MORE YOUNG PEOPLE!" Say instead: "GREAT TO MEET YOU! HOPE YOU COME BACK!" Like everyone else, young adults want to be seen for who they are rather than as just another person their age.

Avoid saying: "HAVE YOU MET OUR OTHER YOUNG ADULTS?" Say instead: "CAN I INTRODUCE YOU TO MY FRIEND? Young people enjoy friends of all ages. We need to welcome them into our community and we should want to get to know them as our friends as well.

When you see someone you don't know: **INTRODUCE YOURSELF, MAKE FRIENDS, BE INTERESTED IN THEM, REACH OUT TO THEM WARMLY, RESPECT THEIR BOUNDARIES.**

This resource was adapted from a handout I saw produced by the Office of Youth and Young Adult Ministries, Unitarian Universalist Association (uua.org/youngadults). It is very helpful. In the United Church of Christ we vocalize that we are a Church of extravagant welcome. These tips help us fulfill our mission of offering hospitality to all and sharing God's love.

Study up, for there could be a test on this material. See you in worship, and if you are inclined take a deeper experience in our Faith Development Classes.

January 2014

- The survey on the Old Parsonage is now complete. When it is signed off by a commissioner we will receive the bill for the work. Then we will be able to contact a realtor and put it on the market for sale. Before that can be done repairs need to be made to the boiler and pipes that were damaged due to the extremely cold weather.
- The Finance Committee discussed keeping our guest vocalist, Eva Morse, on staff for at least the next four months. After that she is planning on moving to Germany. A line item in the budget will be made in the amount of \$2,000 for a guest vocalist.
- St. Stephen now has a new secretary, Janet Manzo. She will start work on January 29 and her hours will be 9:00am to 2:00pm. Her husband is the senior pastor of St. Mark's in New Albany, In.
- Plans are underway to form a choir. Times for rehearsal will be announced and those interested in singing in the choir are encouraged to attend.


