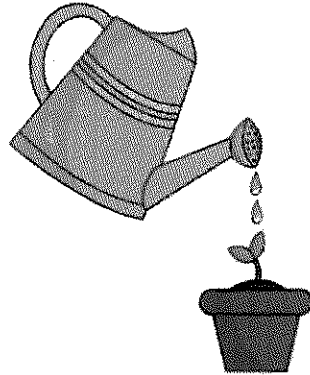

A WORD FROM THE PASTOR



Nelson Mandela, the leader of the African National Conference was imprisoned because he spoke out against apartheid in South Africa. He was imprisoned for twenty-seven years as a political prisoner. All he wanted was equal rights for black South Africans. Although separated from the outside world, he never lost his dedication to the cause. He worked in mines, studied, and organized his fellow prisoners. Mandela was passionate, but unfortunately he was locked up and unable to make public speeches. In the meantime he used his confinement as an opportunity to do something creative.

To survive prison, Mandela started a garden. For years he asked the authorities for some seeds and a place to create his garden. Finally, they relented and Mandela spent months cultivating the soil and nurturing his plants. His first harvest was poor but he continued to make improvements each year. Eventually his garden produced wonderful vegetables and he would present them to the prison guards and officers.

Mandela used his prison time to do something constructive and creative. His garden gave him a sense of purpose during the time he was imprisoned. The garden also gave him a sense of liberation.

As gardening season is upon us, this narrative about Mandela and the power and purpose that gardening gave him while in prison speaks to me about our lives — our lives of faith. What seeds have you planted lately in your life of faith? What have you done spiritually to cultivate your soul? What nutrients have you added to your life of faith that have enhanced your faithfulness?

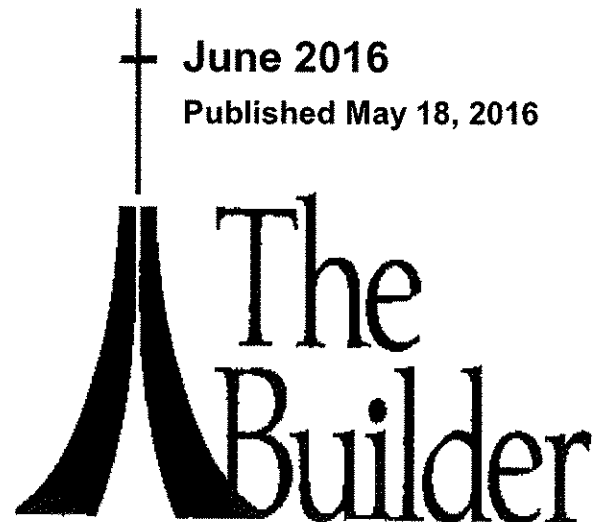
To survive your life — start a *Garden of Faith!* Each of us are ultimately responsible for the faith garden that God has given us. And that *Garden of Faith* will only mature and produce harvestable fruits and vegetables if we are working our souls by planting the seeds of faithfulness and caring for the young growth. But we have to be intentional. Our faith gives us so much, like: strength during times of terror or turmoil; peace and hope in the face of fears; joy in the middle of sorrow; and love in the presence of hate.

Our faith can only grow if we tend to our own *Gardens of Faith.*

We have been helping them adjust to their new life here in Louisville since they arrived. Various trips with the family have been made to help them with buying groceries, necessities, and meeting at KRM.

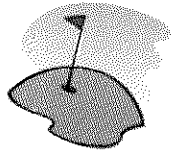



have dropped your land lines and we do not have phone numbers for you. If you do not want your phone number or email printed in the directory we can easily honor that request. Our Church Management Program does this.

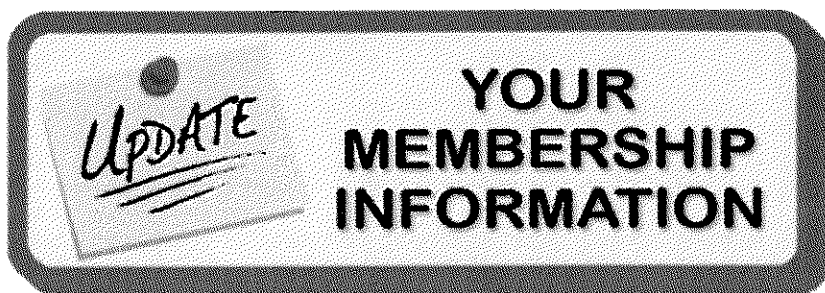

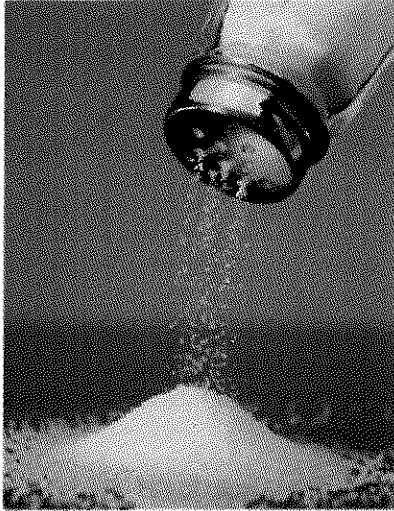

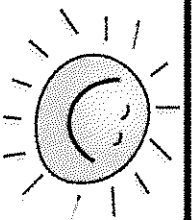
