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## **Time with your Children and the Bible this Week**

### **CHILDREN'S SERMON**

Ask the children if any of them have fallen down and scraped their knees or arms so badly that they couldn't help but cry. Or perhaps they have hit their head on the side of the car or smashed their hand in the car window. Do they remember how much it hurt?

Ask them to pretend that they have just hurt themselves and that they have come to you in their pain. You are going to tell them several things. After you have told them, you want to know which thing you said made them feel better. Any questions?

1. "Don't worry; you will feel better soon."
2. "Don't cry. That won't help."
3. "I did that once myself; I know it hurts."
4. "I'm sorry you are hurting. What can I do to help?"
5. "You better not ride that bicycle again if you are going to fall down."

Ask the children which statement you made, helped them the most? Agree that it was when you said you were sorry and how could you help.

Sometimes we cannot fix what is hurting for another person. And sometimes we cannot see when another person is hurting because they are hurting on the inside. Perhaps their pet died and they are sad. The important thing is to let the other person know you are sorry and you are their friend and will help any way you can.

Close with a prayer: *"Thank you, Jesus, for your example of caring and love. Help us to always be a good friend, especially when our friend is hurting. Amen."*

- ♥ If you have to leave the Sanctuary with your child, feel free to do so, but please come back.
- ♥ If your children are age 5 and under just want to play, as they are made to do, we provide a nursery that is staffed for you.
