A WORD FROM THE PASTOR

Dick Donovan is a pastor, theologian and writer. The other day I came across this story that he wrote about the makeup of the present day Body of Christ — THE CHURCH.

I was talking with an old man who buried his first wife a few months ago. He didn't sit on the shelf long. Widowed in August—married in January. He told me about going with his new wife to her church. That's how he talks about the church. It is always "her church." The funeral for his first wife took place at "her church." Now he goes with his new wife to "her church."

He told me with some glee of sitting in the pew—and looking around—and chuckling under his breath. His new wife asked why he was laughing, and he said, "I can't tell you." She asked again, and he said, "I can't tell you. It would only make you mad."

The truth, of course, was that he could hardly wait to tell her. He was aching to tell her. He wanted desperately to tell her—but he wanted her to beg. He wanted her to say, "Please—pretty please!" When he finally decided that she had "asked for it," he told her why he was laughing. He said, "I'm laughing because of all the hypocrites. This place is full of hypocrites." He laughed again as he told me the story.

I said, "Jim, you are wrong. The church is NOT full of hypocrites. Not FULL! We always have room for one more."

Jim paused for a moment. He was processing what I said—I could see it in his face. Then he smiled when he "got it" —when he realized that I was talking about him—when he realized that I was saying, "Jim, we keep a reserved pew near the front for new hypocrites. Feel free to take your seat."

They say, "It takes one to know one."

But even those of us who love the church must admit that it does have problems. We can trace them back to the beginning. Eleven disciples went to Galilee—not twelve! As [Theologian, Frederick Dale] Bruner says, "The number 'eleven' limps." It reminds us of Judas--of treachery--of betrayal.

BUT Bruner also reminds us, "The church that Jesus sends into the world is fallible, 'elevenish,' imperfect. Yet Jesus uses exactly such a church to do his perfect work.... Jesus takes this imperfect number and gives it a perfect vocation."

I want to say that during the past few months, a Spirit has been moving throughout our fallible, 'elevenish,' imperfect community of faith known as St. Stephen UCC. On Pentecost Sunday, we celebrated the past, the present, and the future as we acknowledged in our worship service the 50th Anniversary of the merger between St. Luke's UCC and Sunnydale UCC during Pentecost Week of 1964.

I am excited for our present and I hope that you are willing to 'take the leap of blind faith' as we serve side-by-side in the future. See you in worship, as much as possible this summer. God is still speaking and we gather together to listen and respond.

Be there for one another; just as God is here for us!
