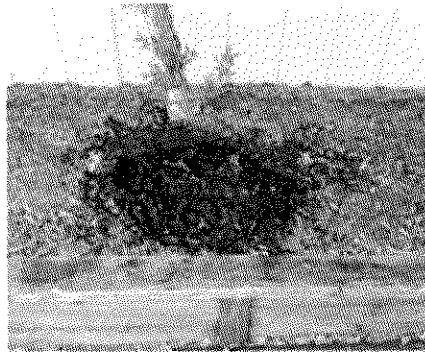

## A WORD FROM THE PASTOR REV. JIM HARPER III

**Pass It On**, written by Kurt Kaiser, is a song that many of you like singing. It suggests that it only takes a spark and then the fire gets going. As you can tell from the picture to the side, we almost had a fire at the Church. Someone threw out a lit cigarette into the mulch bed, next to the Family Life Center. Thankfully one of our faithful walkers let the office know about the fire and it was extinguished.

When we sing or pray about a fire breaking out in our midst, we don't really hope and pray it is a fire that destroys people or property. Instead, we pray for a fire that is symbolic of God's love. We hope that the warmth and the glow will spread around and that everyone within the community of faith and even those outside our walls will experience it.

Over the past nine months we have been warmed by God's love and we have been passing it on as well. The worship/brunch was a great experience. We have received more new members in the past few months than we have in the past five years combined. Attendance is up almost 10% this summer compared to last summer. Since January our collection boxes have been full of soups, soaps, detergents, socks, underwear, peanut butter, canned fruits, shoes, school uniforms, sponges, scrub brushes, and feminine hygiene products. We have all enjoyed the new Chancel Choir as well as the Summer Mass Choir. A Yard Sale, Bake Sales and a Salad Bar generated funds and fun. You as a congregation affirmed in worship three baptisms and pledged to walk with the parents to provide spiritual nurture for these young children as they mature in the faith. As you can tell from this paragraph, all of us have been warming up spiritually in the glow of God's Love and God's movement in our midst.

Please see me or leave a note in the office indicating which time you would prefer. The more people we have, the more fun it is! Remember, you do not have to sing well, just enjoy singing!

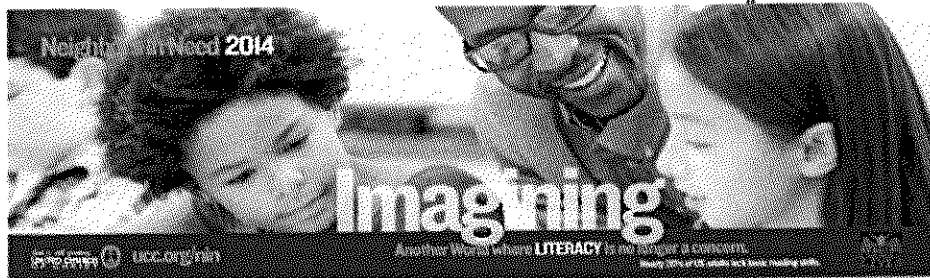


**Neighbors In Need 2014  
 Imagining Another World Is Possible**

Neighbors in Need (NIN) is a special mission offering of the UCC that supports ministries of justice and compassion throughout the United States. One-third of NIN funds support the Council for American Indian Ministry(CAIM). Two-thirds of the offering is used by the UCC's Justice and Witness Ministries(JWM) to support a variety of justice initiatives, advocacy efforts, and direct service projects through grants.

Neighbors in Need grants are awarded to churches and organizations doing justice work in their communities. These grants fund projects whose work ranges from direct service to community organizing and advocacy to address systemic injustice such as immigration, health care, voting rights, civil liberties, and environmental justice. Funding is provided through donations to the Neighbors in Need offering.

St. Stephen will receive the NIN offering on October 5, 2014 as part of our World Communion Sunday observance.





**July 8, 2014 - Highlights**

- ◆ Parsonage Sale - Our initial asking price is \$85,000. The realtor is Mary Kay Elmore.
- ◆ The Kid's Festival is scheduled for August 2. There will be games, prizes and free food for the community around the church.
- ◆ New members will be welcomed during the Worship Brunch on August 3.
- ◆ The Missions Committee is accepting donations of cereal for Shively Area Ministries through the month of July. They will also be collecting lightly used uniforms and new underwear and socks for donation to JCPS.
- ◆ Plans have begun for the Chili Fest and another Trivia Night.
- ◆ Election of new members to Church Council and Christian Education will be soon. Please let Rev. Harper or any member of Church Council know if you are interested in serving.

**August 12, 2014 - Highlights**

- ◆ There were 11 showings of the parsonage to prospective buyers. Their biggest concerns have been the boiler heat and lack of air conditioning.
- ◆ Five people attended the Automated External Defibrillator (AED) and CPR training and are now certified. A new battery and adult electrodes have been installed in the AED. New pediatric electrodes are on order.
- ◆ Church Council agreed by consensus to earmark the Fifth Sunday Special Collection in August for Diersen House.
- ◆ A Congregational Meeting to elect new Church Council and Christian Education will be October 26, 2014. Please consider serving in these positions.
- ◆ There was very positive feedback about the Worship Brunch with Communion. During the Third Sunday Conversations we will discuss more of these alternative worship services.
- ◆ Third Sunday Conversations will resume on September 21. The time will be right after the worship service and a light lunch will be served.

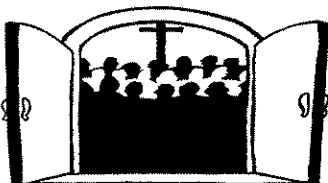
