A WORD FROM THE PASTOR

REV. JIM HARPER III

The National Football League and the city of Baltimore could use some good stories about good guys these days. And Joe Ehrmann's story is a story worth retelling. He was a defensive tackle for the Baltimore Colts. He played in the NFL for nine years. He was chosen to play in a Pro Bowl.

When it came time to retire, Ehrmann could have done any number of things. He could have been one of those on-camera guys--retired players who talk about the game on camera--telling us what we are about to see--or what we just saw. What a nice job! The on-camera guys make good money without taking any hits on the field.

But Ehrmann didn't become an on-camera guy. After he retired from football, he took over the management of *The Door*, a ministry to kids from Baltimore's inner city.

Joe's journey from 'football warrior' to a 'gentle giant' started when his kid brother, Billy, contracted cancer. Joe took care of Billy during his illness and, in the process, found himself reassessing his own life. He began to understand how important God is, especially during life's toughest times. He took the initial and ongoing steps to have a foundational relationship with God. And he found life opening into new vistas that he had not imagined. Reflecting on his life before God was foundational, he says,

"I always thought I would find great meaning in being a professional football player. I always believed that if I could just get enough sacks, if my team could do well enough, if my contract would get big enough, it would all come together and I would be happy. But it never came together."

"It never came together." Don't get the wrong impression. Ehrmann had a highly successful football career--but it didn't bring him the joy that he had expected.

Ehrmann talks about retirement. Football is a young man's game. After nine years in the NFL, Ehrmann was still a young man. He says,

"It is true that a lot of the guys struggle when they retire. They lose that external acclaim, and it's very confusing for them. They don't know what their position is in life."

Think about that for a moment! *"They don't know what their position is in life."* While they were in football, they knew their position. They were a defensive tackle or an offensive tackle or a nose guard. Now they don't know their position. They don't know who they are, and they don't know what to do.

The transition was much easier for Joe. Once he committed himself to Christ, he learned what his new position would be. Christ had called him to be a servant.

At *The Door*, Joe found a kind of happiness that he expected from football but did not find. At *The Door*, kids would race up and give him a big hug. At *The Door*, he found out how worthwhile his life could really be. He said, "I've found what I want to do.... I absolutely love it."

In the years since, Joe has moved on to other forms of ministry, but he continues to serve the same Christ--and he maintains his close connection to *The Door*. He says, "*There's no place I'd rather be.*"

Jesus says, "*Whoever will lose his life for my sake will find it*" (Matthew 16:25). That's what happened for Joe Ehrmann, the football warrior who became a 'Gentle Giant' for Jesus.

And that's what will happen for you and me if we let God become foundational in our lives.

Do you agree? Is this a good story to hear coming out of Baltimore and the NFL?

See you on Sundays in worship, as we too take the steps necessary to letting God become foundational in our lives!

Be there for one another; just as God is here for us!

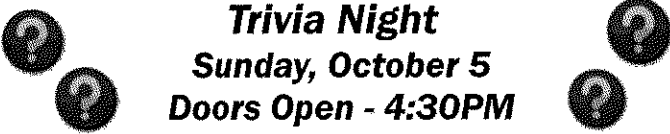

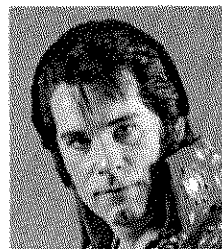

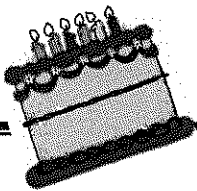


Christian Education

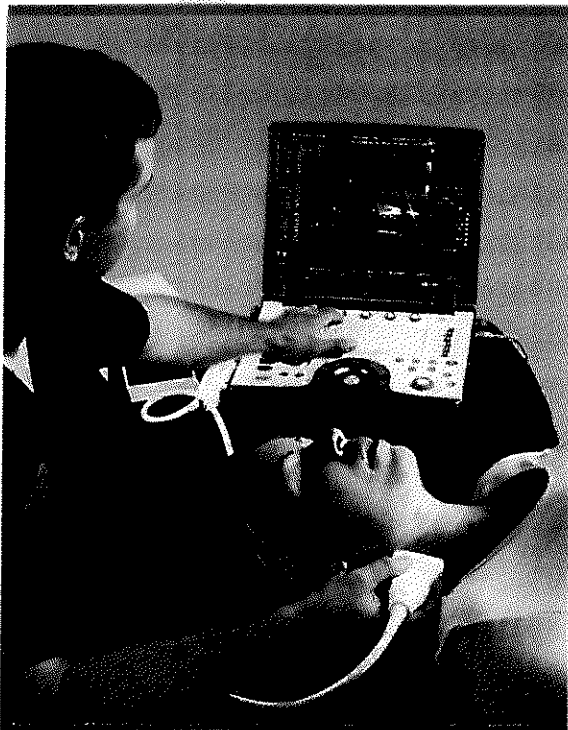
