**Insert**: Strengthen the Church Envelope & Letter

"As sure as ever God puts his children in the furnace he will be in the furnace with them." -Charles H. Spurgeon As I read, pray and study for preaching and writing, I often find too much to share on a traditional Sunday morning; so I save things and share them later. This concept and ideology spoke to me the first time I read it; I hope it does the same for you as your read it today.

Most of us have experienced--or will experience--our world coming apart at the seams. We have experienced--or will experience--devastating blows that threaten to undo us.

Some of those devastating blows come in the form of natural disasters-floods, earthquakes, hurricanes, tornadoes, and the like.

Some of those devastating experiences come in the form of sickness or the death of a loved one.

Some of those devastating experiences come in the form of a financial set-back—the loss of a job—the loss of a home—the prospect of outliving one's money.

When that kind of thing happens to us, we quickly learn what we are made ofand what's really important to us.

Fred Craddock might be a name that is unfamiliar to you, but he was a great preacher and teacher of preachers. He told the story of a hospital visit he made when he was the pastor of a small Oklahoma church. The hospital patient—a woman—called asking Craddock to visit because she was due to have surgery the next morning. There was panic in her voice. Craddock remembered the woman, but realized that he hadn't seen her in church for quite a while.

When he got to her hospital room, Craddock noticed that there was no Bible on the night stand. What he saw were junk magazines—magazines about movie stars and that sort of thing--not a spiritual calorie in the whole "cotton-pickin" bunch." And the woman wondered why she was panic-stricken. She wondered why she had no resources to deal with the storms of life.

Happily, most of us preachers have experienced the exact opposite. Admittedly, the people we visit in the hospital are sometimes worried--sometimes scared--but more often than not they are also sustained by their faith that God is with them and will help them.

How will we respond when our time comes--when the doctor says "Cancer"-or when our husband or wife is dying--or when we find ourselves suddenly broke?

That's hard to say. Soldiers tell us that it's impossible to predict who will be the heroes and who will be the goats--until they come under fire. Some big, burly men break and run--or cower behind a rock. Some very ordinary men and women turn out to be heroes in the mix of battle.

But I will say that I have often had the opportunity to work with people struggling with disaster--and I have often been impressed by their strength and resilience.

And I have come away from those encounters convinced that it is possible to prepare for disaster—not just by storing food and water, but also by doing some soul strengthening. Most of the people with whom I have been privileged to work have been people of faith—people who believed that God was with them and would help them. I have come away from my encounters with those people thanking God for their faith—and for their strength in the face of adversity.

The very best way to prepare for anything and everything that tomorrow will bring is to spend today with God. God is our foundation in the past, in the present and for every moment of our future.
