Remember, by the grace of God, you and I can do something pretty amazing when we give faithfully to God's Kingdom. 

Council Highlights

August 2013

- At the Congregational Meeting on July 14, 2013 a motion was made and voted on to begin the boundary survey
 on the old parsonage property. The council looked into using the property as collateral to get a line of credit to
 help pay for expenses relating to the sale. We were told by PNC that they no longer extend lines of credit to nonprofit organizations. Given the condition of our financial state we will have to look to other means to pay whatever expenses may come up.
- We are looking into having a trivia night as a fundraiser. More research needs to be done before we put a plan
 into action. Also we have the Chilifest coming up. We are considering having a small yard sale that day so save
 your treasures.
- The nominating committee for 2014 Council has been chosen. Please consider and pray on a decision to serve if you are asked.
- A proposal was made by Rev. Harper to cut his hours at St. Stephen and find a part-time job possibly through the night time hours to try to save the church money. The council unanimously agreed that cuts in hours or wages for our dedicated staff should be an absolute last resort. Please pray on what we can do to increase attendance and giving.





Council Highlights

July 2013

- A quorum of council members was established that included two visitors, Victoria Bauer and Emma Goble.
- Our financial situation was discussed. Although expenditures are down from this time last year our receipts are also down. It was suggested to try to get a line of credit on the property at 1867 Farnsley so we can pay for the boundary survey and other expenditures related to the sale. The cost of the survey will be between \$2,400 to \$3,000. The survey proposal will be brought before the Congregational Meeting on July 14, 2013.
- Our thanks to Scott Jennings for donating his time and materials to repair the roof over the vestibule. Also, thanks to the workers who volunteered on the Work Day.
- Our guests, Victoria Bauer and Emma Goble, made a request to have a lock in on August 10th. They would also like to
 participate in the Sunday worship service. Since the church pays part of their camping fees to Merom they would like to
 tell the congregation what they did while at camp and what they learned. They are also inviting kids from other church
 youth groups. After discussing boundaries and what is involved in conducting a worship service the council granted the
 request by consensus.
- Rev. Harper asked the council for permission to look into planning a retreat to Ocoee Inn for white water rafting. Our last retreat to Ocoee Inn was enjoyed by all and if we plan a retreat for this year we'll try for late summer.
- Rev. Harper is participating in an online church renewal program. The point of it is to get the congregation's ideasof where the church is now and where they would like to see it go in the future.
- Rev. Harper asked and was granted vacation time from July 28 through August 4th. Speakers for Sunday services will be arranged.
- There were no children for the first Saturday of Vacation Bible School. The council suggested posting a sign noting the remaining two Saturdays designated for VBS to be cancelled.
