I am only one, but still I am one.

You have probably heard or read something of Aleksandr Solzhenitsyn (pronounced: soul-shi-NEAT-sun), he was a Nobel-prize winning author--but did you know how difficult his life was. His father was killed in a hunting accident shortly before Aleksandr's birth, so he was raised by a single mother--in the Soviet Union just after the Communists had taken power. In that atheistic nation, this single mother raised her son, Aleksandr as a Christian--in the Russian Orthodox faith.

During World War II, Solzhenitsyn served as a battery commander in the Red Army. However, he got into some trouble. Having written letters criticizing Stalin, he was accused and convicted of anti-Soviet propaganda. He spent eleven years in the prison camps known as the gulags. While imprisoned, he was diagnosed with cancer.

At one point things got so bad that he contemplated suicide as a way to end his physical and emotional suffering. He no longer cared whether the guards might kill him--so it became increasingly likely that he would do something to provoke them.

One day while on a work detail, Solzhenitsyn sat down during a break. A man sat down next to him--a man whom he had never seen before and would never see again. The stranger took a stick and drew a cross in the dirt--thus identifying himself as a Christian--as Solzhenitsyn's Christian brother. For Solzhenitsyn, that simple gesture was a turning point. As he witnessed that stranger's faith, a spark of faith ignited in his own heart. He found a new courage and a new will to live.

The point is simply this: When we as Christian are willing to stand up and be counted--even by something so simple as a faithful word or a deed of mercy--it makes a difference in a person's life. A stranger in a prison camp shared his faith by drawing a cross in the dirt--and it made a difference to Solzhenitsyn. Ultimately, that gesture made a difference to the world, because Solzhenitsyn's later writings helped to crack the hard shell of the Soviet Union.

Who knows what difference you and I might make--by simply being faithful? God knows! Often, our faithful word or deed will be nothing more than a seed. It will take time to germinate and grow. We might not personally see its fruit. But I believe that one of the joys of heaven will be when God takes us aside and says, "Do you remember when you said this? Let me show you how I turned your faithful word into a blessing." Or "Do you remember when you gave this person a helping hand? Let me show you what I did with your little kind gesture."

Never underestimate the importance of the little things you do and say. We live and work by the power of the Holy Spirit--God's Spirit living in us. When we are faithful, God brings our faithfulness to life--bearing thirty-fold--or sixty-fold--or a hundred-fold.

See you in worship soon and very soon. Amen.

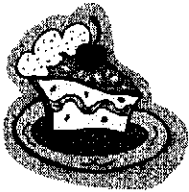

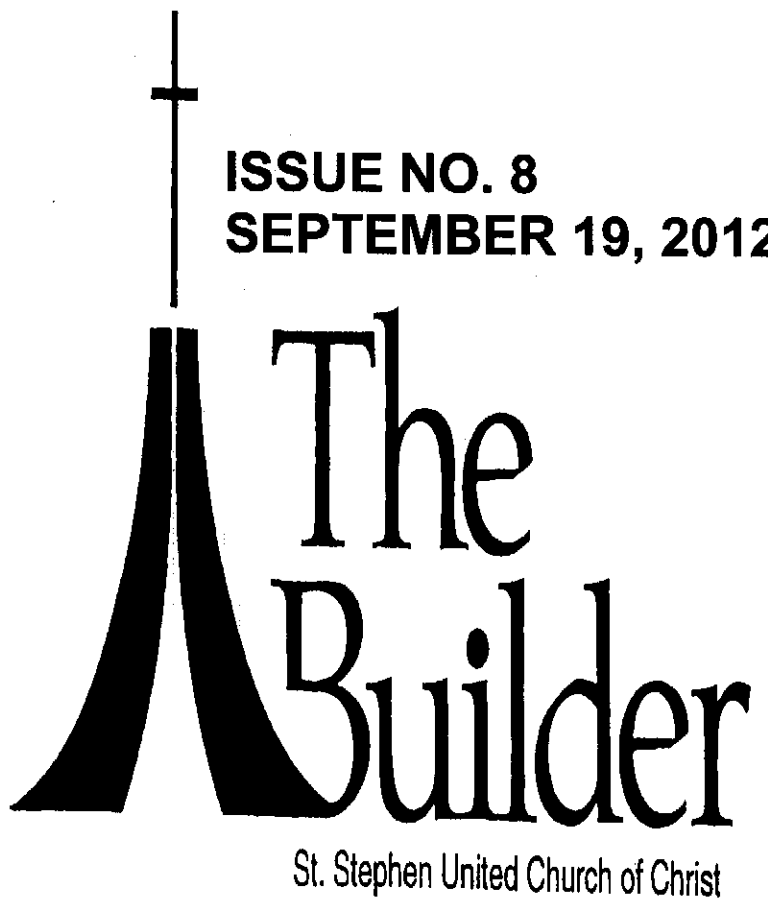
