Food Basket Envelopes

We are at the time of the year when we give. We give because God has created us to be generous people. We are also asked not to judge a situation or a person. That is so hard not to do, because as human beings we seem to be hardwired to judge easier than we are wired to give generously. God encourages us to do the hard work in our heart, souls and intellect. God desires that we take the steps necessary to mature as a faithful followers of Christ. Let me explain what I am trying to say by sharing the following article:

We're on the train on our way home. We strike up a conversation with someone sitting next to us. He's wearing a suit and has a Bluetooth in his ear, an iPhone in his hand and a laptop on his lap. He works for an insurance company in New York City. He asks what we do, and after we describe our careers, the conversation takes an interesting turn.

He tells us about his younger sister, who is living in North Carolina ... has six children [and was deserted by her husband]. ... This sister has only ever been a stay-at-home mom and only has a high school diploma. She's been looking for a job, but so far hasn't found one. ... She's depleted her savings, maxed out her credit cards and the landlord has begun eviction proceedings. She gets multiple calls from creditors each day. She's depressed and anxious.

Our train companion then asks us what she should do? We put on our social work hats and proceed to give him a public benefits 101 overview and discuss the mental health services available, and he appreciates it greatly. Then he says: "It must be hard helping people in your line of work because most of them are just looking for a handout and trying to work the system, and as a result, we pay higher taxes to pay for them." We both looked at him in disbelief. He had just told us a story about how anyone can become homeless—even his own sister—yet he was holding on to one of the many damaging myths regarding those who are homeless and living in poverty. It took a lot of effort not to say "Are you kidding me?" ... But really, the point is that here is someone who has a sister facing many of the issues our clients do, and yet the power of the "lazy homeless" myth is so strong that he feels compelled to bring it up during the same discussion when he's seeking help?

Here is our exercise of faith that can lead to faithfulness: Next time you are going to give; get a name, try to listen to a story. If you don't have time for that, picture the person you are helping as someone's sister, or brother, or mother or father. If that is too hard, just give and don't judge. Trust that God will bless the person who is at the point of reception and God will also give you warm and joyous embrace. Live faithfully and give generously.

## Thanksgiving and Turkey Fun Facts

- In the United States, about 280 million turkeys are sold for the Thanksgiving celebrations.
- Each year, the average American eats somewhere between 16-18 pounds of turkey.
- Californians are the largest consumers of turkey in the United States.
- Thanksgiving Day is celebrated on the fourth Thursday in November in the United States.
- Although Thanksgiving is widely considered an American holiday, it is also celebrated on the second Monday in October in Canada.
- Benjamin Franklin wanted the turkey to be the national bird of the United States.
- Sarah Josepha Hale, an American magazine editor, persuaded Abraham Lincoln to declare Thanksgiving a national holiday. She is also the author of the popular nursery rhyme "Mary Had a Little Lamb."
- Since 1947, the National Turkey Federation has presented a live turkey and two dressed turkeys to the President. The President does not eat the live turkey. He "pardons' it and allows it to live out its days on a historical farm.
- The heaviest turkey ever raised was 86 pounds and about the size of a large dog.
- Turkeys will have 3,500 feathers at maturity.
- Male turkeys gobble. Hens do not. They make a clucking noise.
- Turkeys have heart attacks. The US Air force was doing test runs and breaking the sound barrier, when nearby turkeys dropped dead with heart attacks.
