### There is a paradigm

Shift that is needed in today's society when it comes to effective, growing, relevant communities of faith and it is somewhat illustrated in this diagram.

We really don't have much to loose. We have been a mostly CONSUMER CHURCH for now almost 50 years. It has served a purpose and many folks have come to the Church and been



fed, had their spiritual needs met and a whole hall full of pictures show evidence that the professional laity have taught the children about God and initiated them into the membership. But in relationship to being educated we run into the problem of our youth and young adults not being empowered.

To borrow a quote from a friend and once Interim Conference Minister of the IKC, John Gantt; "Confirmation over the years has been the formate in which we graduate young people out of the Church!" As I look up and down our 'Hall of Confirmation Pictures', I can't help but see less than 35% retention of the Youth in any church experience, and somewhere around 23% retention into the life of our own community of faith.

We might need to consider a paradigm shift that is reflective in the above diagram. But before we can get to a paradigm shift we need to see 1. "Who Were We?"; 2. "Who Are We?"; "3. Who Are We Going To Be?" That is why we gathered ON Sunday night at the Ice Cream Social/Brainstorming meeting. Those are three vital questions for all of us to consider. If you did make it to the meeting, then you know the information and the energy that fill the fellowship hall that night. If you didn't get to be a part of the evening, there is still time for you to answer these questions and share them with the whole community. I invite all of us to bring our ideas to the table. If you want to share your ideas, then please answer these questions from your perspective and turn them into the office. In a week or two, all of our ideas will be shared with all.


# Christian Education
